	Entry fee is \$120.00, players can enter in up to three disciplines, 1 x Singles, 1 x Doubles and 1 x Mixed Doubles.
Entries:	All players competing in the Individual Championships will be deemed to have read and accepted the conditions under which the Individual Championships are to be conducted. The National competition regulations shall apply where modified by organisers.
	The organisers can NOT be held responsible for any injury sustained, at any time, by any player or official arising from their participation in these Championships. Any costs incurred for medical treatment and/or hospitalisation under this current pandemic scenario shall be borne by the players concerned.

	U19 – players must be above the age of 14 as of 1st of January and under the age of 19 years as of the 31st of December in the year of the Championships.
	For Australian registered players, Under clause 2.1 of the Australian National Championships (Individual) By-Laws "Players must reside in Australia for a minimum of 6 Months prior to the start of this event". All entrants must be registered and in good standing with their State/Territory member organisation.
By Laws	These Championships will be held as per the Badminton Australia National Championships By-Laws (Effective from 1 February 2024.
	Individual seeding will be based on the National Ranking list as of June 27.
	Withdrawal without penalty: June 27
Seedings, Draws and Withdrawals:	6.3 Seeding for all Individual Championships will be based on the BA National Rankings as at 14 days prior to the individual event commencing. The draw for the individual events will be released up to 7 days prior to the commencement of the individual championships.
Coaches:	Registered Coaches who want to be able to coach players during the YONEX U19 National Individual Championships are required to submit a request for a Coach Accreditation prior to the event.

	Play will commence at 9am each day unless otherwise notified. Enquiries relating to the starting times of matches will be the responsibility of Players and Team Managers. Players must be available to play at least 10 minutes before their scheduled time.
Schedules	Each player/pair must bring one line judge to the court for all their matches.
	Note: Individual Events may commence Thursday July 11 subject to entry numbers
	Depending on the total number of entries, Semi Finals may be played on the same day as Finals.
	Award ceremonies will be scheduled after competition has concluded for the day.
Practice Courts:	Practice courts will be in the same venue as competition courts.
Shuttles/Stringing:	Suitable quality YONEX shuttles will be used for the tournament. There will be two speeds available. Stringing Service will be available
Medical/Physio:	First Aid Available/Physio TBC
	Clothing and advertising are to be in accordance with the BWF General Competition Regulations (sections 20-24) including State/Territory representative uniforms.
Clothing and Advertising:	In regard to shorts, maximum one (1) advertisement no larger than 20 square cm (Reference to GCR 24.3.3) plus State Badminton Logo no larger than 50 square cm on the opposite leg.
Competition Rules and Regulations	These Championships will be conducted in accordance with BWF General Competition Regulations, BWF code of Conduct Policies, and the Badminton Australia National Championships By-Laws (Effective from 1 February 2024). These Championships will be conducted using BWF ALTERNATIVE SERVICE RULE 9.1.6 (a) the whole shuttle shall be below the server's waist at the instant of being hit by the server's racket. The waist shall be considered to be an imaginary line around the body, level with the lowest part of the server's bottom rib; (b) the shaft and the racket head of the server's racket at the instant of hitting the shuttle shall be pointing in a downward direction.

Requirements

Sport Integrity Australia	All participants are highly encouraged to complete the Sport Integrity Australia online education requirements, this includes players, coaches, court officials, team officials and volunteers. Participant Obligations:	Players, coaches, officials, volunteers and staff acknowledge and agree that whilst participating they must: (A) Comply with all Badminton Australia policies, procedures, rules and regulations (which can be obtained at www.badminton.org.au or from BA Staff);
	 (B) Follow any lawful instructions or directions of BA; (C) Report any safeguarding concerns immediately to event organisers Parent/Guardian of a participant under the age of 18 also agree to the participant
	obligations. The Participant acknowledges that if they (including the Participants parent/guardian) breach any BA policy, procedure, rule, regulation, direction, fails to follow any lawful instruction or direction of BA or engages in any behaviour that, in the opinion of BA, has the potential to bring/s the Participant, BA, the Activities or the sport of badminton into disrepute, BA may take action including, but not limited to, suspending or dismissing the Participant from further participation in the event.
	Participants acknowledge and agree that they are required to: (A) give 100% in all matches, activities and training sessions and display fine sportsmanship at all times; (B) display courteous and ethical behaviour both on and off the court; and (C) comply with the information set out by BA.
Transport:	Players and participants are responsible for their own transport to the Kingsway Indoor Stadium for their respective matches. Interstate participants will be responsible for their own transport to Perth.
Accommodation:	Participants are required to book their own accommodation for the events that they are competing in during these Championships. Please refer to booking details below. The organisers strongly advises participants to book their accommodation early; as there are a number of events happening in Perth at the same time.

Child Safety

Responsibility	Badminton Australia and its State/Territory Members are committed to promoting and protecting the interests and safety of all children and young people and has zero tolerance for anything that compromises the health and well-being of children. Everyone involved with Badminton Australia, its players, coaches, officials, staff, contractors, volunteers, affiliated clubs, committees and any person involved in Badminton activities are responsible for the care and protection of children under the age of 18. This includes reporting information about harm or risk of harm to a child or young person to the relevant authority. Anti-Doping Information

Anti-Doping

Doping control in badminton, in accordance with BWF Anti-Doping Regulations, is conducted out of competition and in competition with the collection of urine and/or blood samples. Athletes are responsible for any substance found in their body.

Before an athlete takes any medication, they should check with their doctor, and if necessary, get a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE).
