COMPETITION RULES

- A. Teams consist of a minimum of 2 male + 2 female and a maximum of 3 male + 3 female players.
- B. No player may play in more than one team.
- C. Players must be ranked according to ability and will hold that rank for the duration of the competition. The strongest player ranked #1.
- D. Singles can be played by any player – and this can change each Tie.
- E. A Tie will consist of 8 matches, total of 15 games (each game to 21 points, no setting):

Match 1. Men's Singles (2 games)	Match 2. Women's Singles (1 game)
Match 3. Men's Doubles (2 games)	Match 4. Women's Doubles (2 games)
Match 5. Mixed Doubles 4 th pair (2 games)	Match 6. Mixed Doubles 3 rd pair (2 games)
Match 7. Mixed Doubles 2 nd pair (2 games)	Match 8. Mixed Doubles 1 st pair (2 games)
- F. No player may play in more than 4 matches in any tie.
- G. The playing order in a Tie may be changed if both Captains are in agreement.
- H. There are four (4) Mixed Doubles matches. Pair 1 is the strongest combination, with Pair 4 the weakest combination. The same player combination cannot be used twice.
- I. The Clubs and Associations entering several teams are asked to rank their teams in order of ability and nominate in which division the Team wishes to play, Division #1 being the strongest.
- J. Junior division players must all be born in 2004 or later.
- K. The Organising Committee reserves the right to place teams in the most appropriate Division once all entries have been received.
- L. For detailed information on how the winners and places will be determined, please see Appendix.
- M. Metro players can only be used to fill teams if necessary. The Organising Committee will determine the number required. Metro players cannot be the majority of players in the team.
- N. A metro team may be entered by the Organising Committee if it is felt this will improve the competition – e.g. to make an even number of teams. No metro team may win the Division trophy regardless of finishing position.

BADMINTON WA MEMBERSHIP

All players who are not current registered members of Badminton WA are required to pay \$17 event membership fee.

PHOTOGRAPHY AT THE EVENT

Photos and videos of participants, guests and spectators may be taken during the event, and may be subsequently used in Badminton WA publications and online resources. By entering the event you agree to such use of the photos / videos. Due to the way events are run it is not possible to guarantee that any one individual is never captured in any of the photos / videos taken. If you do not want a photo or a video where you feature as one of the main subjects to be used in Badminton WA publications and online resources, please make this known to the match desk when first entering the venue on your arrival to the event.

Appendix

1. The winner of a Match will be determined by:

- 1.1. Winning both games in a match consisting of 2 games, or winning the only game if the match only consists of one game.
- 1.2. If the games score is 1:1, then the side with a greater difference between points won and points lost will be the winner.
- 1.3. If the difference in points is equal, then the match result is a “draw”.

2. The winner of a Tie will be determined by:

- 2.1. Winning the most matches in that tie.
- 2.2. If equal matches, then winning the most games in that tie.
- 2.3. If equal games, then having a greater difference between total points won and points lost in that tie.
- 2.4. If equal difference in points then the winner will be determined by drawing lots.

3. Final placings in the Division will be determined by:

- 3.1. Winning the most ties.
- 3.2. If two teams have won the same number of ties, the winner of the tie between them will be ranked higher.
- 3.3. If three or more teams have won the same number of ties, ranking will be established by the difference between total matches won and total matches lost, with greater difference ranked higher.
 - 3.3.1. If this still leaves two teams equal, the winner of the tie between them will be ranked higher.
- 3.4. If three or more teams are still equal, ranking will be established by the difference between total games won and total games lost, with greater difference ranked higher.
 - 3.4.1. If this still leaves two teams equal, the winner of the tie between them will be ranked higher.
- 3.5. If three or more teams are still equal, ranking will be established by the difference between total points won and total points lost, with greater difference ranked higher.
 - 3.5.1. If this still leaves two teams equal, the winner of the tie between them will be ranked higher.
- 3.6. If three or more teams are still equal, then ranking will be established by drawing lots.
- 3.7. If a team is unable to complete all their group ties, all the results of that team shall be deleted.
- 3.8. If a team is unable to complete a match in a tie (e.g. retiring from a match due to illness, injury etc), the result of that match shall count as if completed without the retiring side scoring another point.
